(opening 2011), 3939 Spring Valley Road, Addison, 75001 – Named for the 41st President of the United States.

Adelfa Botello Callejo Elementary School

(opening 2012), to be located in Pleasant Grove – Named for the Dallas lawyer and activist.

Billy Earl Dade Middle School

(opening 2013), replacement school to be located in the Fair Park area.

Kathlyn Joy Gilliam Collegiate Academy

(opening 2011), 1700 E. Camp Wisdom Road, 75241 – Named for the former member of the Dallas ISD Board of Trustees.

Ebby Halliday Elementary School

(opening 2011), 10210 Teagarden Road, Dallas, 75217 – Named for the local realtor and business leader.

Zan Wesley Holmes Jr. Middle School

(opening 2012), 2939 St. Rita Drive, 75233 – Named for the Dallas pastor and public education advocate.

Jose “Joe” May Elementary School

(opening 2012), to be located in the Bachman Lake area – Named for the former member of the Dallas ISD Board of Trustees.

Ann Richards Middle School

(opening 2012), 3831 N. Prairie Creek Road, 75227 – Named for the former Texas governor.

Thelma Elizabeth Page Richardson Elementary School

(opening 2013), to be located in Pleasant Grove – Named for the long-time Dallas educator.

Oran M. Roberts Elementary School

(opening 2013), replacement school to be located in the Fair Park area.

(opening 2012), to be located in Seagoville.

REPURPOSED SCHOOLS

The term repurposed refers to schools that will be substantially and dramatically recreated through the renovation of existing buildings. Three schools will be repurposed as part of the 2008 bond program. Two of these campuses will serve students in Wilmer-Hutchins and will receive multimillion dollar makeovers to create virtually new facilities. The repurposed schools include:

Kennedy-Curry Middle School

Barack Obama Male Leadership Academy at B.F. Darrell

(opening 2011), 4730 S. Lancaster Road, 75216 – located on the site of the former B.F. Darrell Elementary School in Oak Cliff.

Wilmer-Hutchins High School

(opening 2011), 5520 Langdon Road, 75241
